Please Join Speaker: Dr. Richard Estes

*Richard Estes started his PhD research into the ecology and behavior of the wildebeest in Ngorongoro Crater in 1963. Six years later, he published his PhD thesis, which focused on its territorial behavior. Since then, Estes has never stopped writing about wildebeests and other animals of the African savannah. He is the author of two well-known books on African ungulates, carnivores, and primates: *The Behavior Guide to African Mammals* and *The Safari Companion*.*

He is currently a member of the IUCN Species Survival Commission and retired chairman of the Antelope Specialist Group. He is a Research Associate of the Smithsonian Institution's Centre for Research and Conservation, a Trustee of the Rare Species Conservatory, and an Associate of the Harvard Museum of Natural History. Last but not least, he is affiliated with ANE as a Distinguished Scientist in the Department of Environmental Studies.
